To amend An Act Making appropriations to provide for the expenses of the government of the District of Columbia for the fiscal year ending June thirteenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and for other purposes, to repeal the requirement that the abutting property be assessed when new sidewalks or curbing are required to be laid on streets.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Sidewalk and Curbing Assessment Amendment Act of 2002".

Sec. 2. The third unnumbered paragraph under the subheading "Repairs, County Roads" under the heading "Streets" of An Act making appropriations to provide for the expenses of the government of the District of Columbia for the fiscal year ending June thirteenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and for other purposes, approved August 7, 1894 (28 Stat. 250; D.C. Official Code § 9-401.04), is amended to read as follows:

Amend § 9-401.04

"When new sidewalks, alleys, or curbing are required to be laid on streets being improved, no cost shall be assessed against abutting property.".

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 4. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of Congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
