To amend the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978 to provide government employees leave with pay to serve as an organ or a bone marrow donor.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Organ and Bone Marrow Donor Leave Amendment Act of 2002".

Sec. 2. Title XII of the District of Columbia Government Comprehensive Merit Personnel Act of 1978, effective December 3, 1979 (D.C. Law 2-139; D.C. Official Code § 1-612.01 *et seq.*), is amended by adding a new section 1203b to read as follows:

Amend § 1-612.03b

"Sec. 1203b. Donor leave.

- "(a) An employee shall be entitled to up to 30 days of leave to serve as an organ donor, and up to 7 days of leave to serve as a bone marrow donor, without loss or reduction in pay, leave, or credit for time of service, in a calendar year.
- "(b) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section shall only apply if the employee is a volunteer donor, and any compensation received by the employee is limited to costs and expenses associated with organ or bone marrow donations.
- "(c) The Mayor shall prescribe rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this section.".
 - Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of Congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved
